Flood of 2011... Snowfall for the 2010-2011 winter rivers' watersheds have been well above average, from St. Louis east

> to Cleveland, north to the Great Lakes and as far west as Great Falls, Montana, even into Canada!

Flood of 2011

The Kaskaskia watershed took on twice the normal average amounts of water flowing downstream, adding to the drastic flood potential of the Mississippi River downstream. The Army Corps of Engineers held back and is holding back water in many areas to ease flooding in all the big rivers. Many areas flooded and are still flooded due to the massive amounts of water. Lake Shelbyville and Carlyle Lake were kept high and water



in the state during April across Illinois was 7.45 inches, about double the typical average is 3.83 inches adding to the snowmelt well underway. Snow amounts, plus excess rain throughout the Ohio, Mississippi and Missouri wasn't released until the lower

Kaskaskia and Mississippi rivers could handle the extra flow. This resulted in Carlyle Lake cresting at 458.25 feet above mean seal level (how the ACOE measures the lake

level) on May 5th - the 2nd highest level since the lake was created in 1967. The previous record high lake level was 459.80 feet, which occurred in May of 2002. The rainfall in May and June this year for our local area has also exceeded averages, keeping Carlyle Lake well above the normal Summer pool - the recent crest again ex-

ceeded 455 in spite of very high water release levels - upwards of 10,000 cubic feet of water per second at many times this Spring! The current expectations are that Carlyle Lake will remain well above Summer pool of 445 feet into August, assuming typical rainfall in our area. Many areas flooded and were totally un-useable for several weeks. However, Tradewinds Marina was still OPEN, as long as patrons were willing to park on the levy and paddle out to the their boats!




