A 40,000 pound pipeline barge was delivered to Tradewinds Marina on the 30th of November. It was delivered by a semi and was launched at the Keyesport ramp much easier than anticipated. It is 18 feet wide and 48 feet long. Although it potentially has many uses, the first use will hopefully be to load an excavator onto it and remove some silt from the Tradewinds Marina haul out pit. Some modifications will have to be made first though. In order to make the barge more stable we will have to add spud poles, probably one on each corner, that will drop into the lake bottom and prevent excess movement. The other modification will be to remove some pieces welded to the surface of the barge to make it easier for the excavator to maneuver on the barge. Once this is completed the barge should be a great asset to the lake.

The CLA paid for transportation and made a lot of the arrangements for the use of the barge. Also, budget cuts again this year are forcing the ACE to close campgrounds early, sheriff patrol cut backs, and less maintenance for facilities. (See the article, page 5...)

Finally, please note that the clubhouse is now smoke-free according to Illinois law. We ask that all patrons abide by the law for the benefit of all members and so that the marina can avoid any unfortunate circumstances brought by violations. Thank you! ~ **Jason Eveland, Marina Manager**



Oppose the Carlyle Lake Budget Cuts

February 21, 2008, Carlyle Lake Association, Carlyle, IL—The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers have received reduced budgets for 2008, resulting in a \$700,000 shortage. The impact to the area will be significant, and it's up to the citizens and visitors who support Carlyle Lake to oppose these reductions and have these downward budget trends reversed.

The Corps has released information concerning the reduced camping seasons, reduced services, and reduced support for local events. The smaller staff reduces organized hunting opportunities, campground patrols, campground availability, and overall a standard of service that will be less than we've come to expect in years past. These cuts result in a tremendous negative impact to recreation, the environment, the local economy, just to name a few.

This latest cut brings to light a disturbing trend—a downward spiral of funding available for Carlyle Lake to employ in providing operation and service for the lake. Next year's budget, for instance, will be "more of the same." These shrinking budgets have impacted available staff and resources for the last several years, and now, the impact will send a ripple effect through the region.

Even if you're not a visitor of Carlyle Lake, but just a local citizen, these reductions will affect you. Fewer visitors means less money spent in the area, and fewer jobs. Relocated visitors might permanently stop coming to Carlyle Lake, and Carlyle Lake's regional economic impact within 30 miles of the project is an estimated 68 million dollars—an impact that is at risk of free-falling with reduced camping seasons and a reduced ability to attract visitors.

The central question—why have these budgets been reduced? The Corps has indicated that their budgets are being developed based on performance. The Carlyle Lake Association has learned that Carlyle Lake is among the top visited Corps of Engineers lakes in the nation and the lake provides a tremendous amount of flood control. In fact, the entire Kaskaskia Watershed has been recognized by the Corps as a "model" of how other watersheds should operate. This does not seem to be a "performance based" system that is working, or fair. There is also a general misunderstanding about fees collected—all fees collected by Carlyle Lake do not become available to Carlyle Lake for use. These fees go to the national treasury, while all other federal agencies that collect recreation fees are allowed to retain them and put them to good use for their own facilities and communities.

"The reasons for reducing Carlyle Lake's budget don't add up," says Greg Kintz, owner / operator of Tradewinds Marina.

"The lake is too valuable and enjoyed by too many people for this to happen." He added that it is up to motivated citizens and Carlyle Lake visitors to make their voices collectively heard by the people that can answer these difficult questions and become our representatives for change—our local, elected officials. Please take the time to contact your representatives. Let them know that Carlyle Lake is critical to the area and deserves to have their normal funding restored. Silence will assure that these downward trends continue, and if they do, expect the level of services and availability to continue reducing. 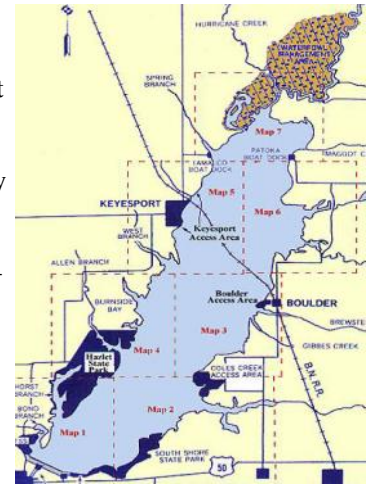

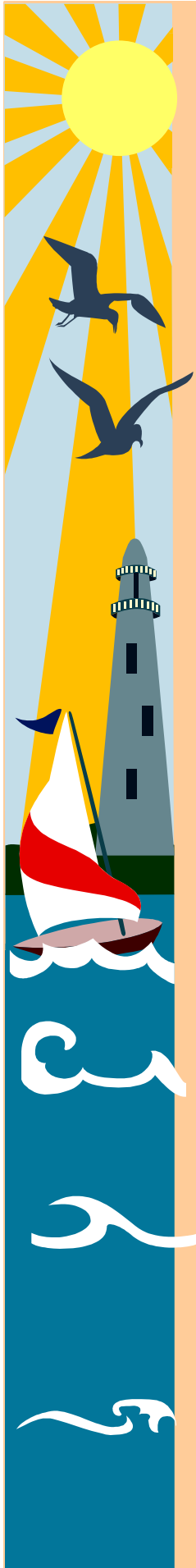

Intro to Sail

Is simply a "Three Hour Tour" where a group of 2-4 can test the waters to see if sailing is of interest. Some parties just want a joy ride or see how their spouse reacts. Other classes have been refresher courses with clear objectives to accomplish during their course.

Basic Keelboat Sailing (BKB-101)

This course assumes no prior knowledge or experience. It is a learn to sail & safe boating class. There are many ASA standards to meet but ultimately the student goes from a novice to someone I would feel comfortable lending my boat to in about 9 hours of shore conference & 8 hours aboard. I offer 2 formats, 3 classes on weekday evenings / sail following weekend or Friday evening to Sunday afternoon. Many Spouses and kids find it more comfortable to learn from me than "The Skipper of the House".

Basic Coastal Cruising (BCC-103)

So you have some experience sailing but you are ready to enjoy a more complex boat or new cruising grounds. BCC will sharpen skills learned in 101 and introduce new topics that will give you the confidence to take a bigger boat into more challenging weather and cruising grounds. ASA requires 101 as prerequisite but I would further recommend some good experience (ie. Mistakes) between 101 and 103. This class is offered in a Friday - Sunday format.

Bareboat Chartering BBC-104

When you are ready to really have some sailing fun, get your name on the list and I will send you more information.
